

PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

This agreement is between Ngā Aho Incorporated (Ngā Aho) and New Zealand Institute of Landscape Architects Inc. (NZILA) (collectively 'the parties'). The agreement seeks to affirm a relationship between two important sector bodies in recognition of common interests. Both parties serve and inform Aotearoa/New Zealand design communities.

The agreement provides a statement of recognition and intent, as well as providing relationship principles between the parties. The agreement is not legally binding on either of the parties.

Statement of Recognition:

Ngā Aho recognises NZILA as the pre-eminent organisation for promoting the profession of landscape architecture in Aotearoa/New Zealand and other objects as set out in the NZILA constitution.

NZILA recognises Ngā Aho as the pre-eminent national organisation representing the collective interests of Māori design professionals, including the roopu of Māori landscape architects and associated professionals known collectively as Te Tau-a-Nuku.

Statement of Intent:

Both parties to the agreement seek to:

- Enter into a reciprocal relationship of support and understanding in areas of common interest
- Raise the standing of their members, and standards of practice within their professional domains and spheres of interest
- Positively contribute to the social, cultural, environmental and economic development of Aotearoa/New Zealand

This intent will be given effect through:

- Reciprocating in the provision of information, advice and support to one another on the recognition of individual and shared knowledge and beliefs, fields of expertise and spheres of interest
- Referring key stakeholders to each other's organisations as appropriate in accordance with each other's field of expertise
- Meeting at least once per year to explore opportunities for collaboration and agreeing on any joint action plans
- Te Tau-a-Nuku will be the primary group acting for Ngā Aho in this relationship, however the mana within this relationship lies with Ngā Aho and NZILA

Partnership Principles:

The parties will work with each other in accord with the following principles:

<i>Mana</i>	Authority and standing	Recognising and supporting the authority and standing of each organisation
<i>Manaakitanga</i>	Hospitality and reciprocity	Extending hospitality and reciprocity to one another
<i>Mahi Tahī</i>	Collaboration	Working together for the benefit of each and all
<i>Kaitiakitanga</i>	Custodianship	Acting consistently and responsibly as custodians of all people, cultures and environments
<i>Aroha</i>	Respect and understanding	Working within a common understanding which places value on involvement and which recognises each parties best endeavours
<i>Manawanui</i>	Commitment	Working collaboratively to ensure that the relationship between the parties is kept warm at every occasion

Execution:

We the undersigned parties pledge our support and commitment to this agreement in the spirit of goodwill, recognising that giving effect to the agreement will be a process of discussion and negotiation between the parties and in some cases the commitment of effort and resources to agreed work plans.


